## HOW GREAT IS THE CREATOR OF ALL THINGS?

O LORD, thou hast searched me, and known me.

The number of people who believe in the God of the Bible continues to diminish. The postmodern society of our emergent generation keeps whittling away at the attributes of God. They have poured out like water His omniscience, omnipresence, and omnipotence into a melting pot and recreated something that resembles modern art—and who can really tell what that is. All constraints of hermeneutical principles, which are the laws that govern Bible interpretation, no longer apply to this group of pulpiteers. Whatever they say becomes fact simply because they've said it. Whoever challenges their authority then becomes an enemy of truth. This mindset fits well with many aspects of how the Watchtower (WT) has arrived at its major doctrines. Did you know that the WT teaches that God did not know that Adam and Eve would sin? To a Jehovah's Witness God is only Jehovah, the Father: Jesus is a created being, Michael the Archangel, and the Holy Spirit is a force. Jehovah's Witnesses (JWs) do not believe that God is omniscient. If God did not know the beginning from the end, He would be spending all of His time putting out the bushfires of man's wickedness. Psalms 139 would be abstract and these verses would be totally meaningless:

1Joh 3:20 *For if our heart condemn us, God is greater than our heart, and knoweth all things.*

Matt 12:36 *But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give*

*account thereof in the day of judgment.*

Rev 17:8 *The beast that thou sawest was, and is not; and shall ascend out of the bottomless pit, and go into perdition: and they that dwell on the earth shall wonder, whose names were not written in the book of life from the foundation of the world, when they behold the beast that was, and is not, and yet is.*

The truth is that God is omniscient and knows everything about everything and everyone without the constraint of time. He is awesome!

Now how can we apply what we have learned here to help us in witnessing to a Jehovah's Witness? Since JWs do not believe that Jesus is the Eternal Son of God, they search for scriptures that would challenge our belief that there is One God who is Triune. One example of how JWs are taught by WT leaders to challenge our belief that Jesus is coequal and coeternal with all members of the Godhead comes from this verse: Mark 13:32 *But of that day and that hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels which are in heaven, neither the Son, but the Father.* Their point here is because Jesus does not know the time, He cannot be God. You don't have to respond to this statement, but simply ask them: "If the Father did not know (of course He did) that Adam would sin, does that mean He cannot be God?" At this point the discussion is ended and you would have helped the JW to see that the WT teachings are unreliable.
